



PETALUMA POLICE DEPARTMENT TRAFFIC COLLISION INFORMATION EXCHANGE

Collisions that involve property damage only are not investigated by the Petaluma Police Department unless circumstances exist which impact public safety. As a convenience to involved parties, this traffic collision information exchange form is provided to facilitate the exchange of information at the scene of the collision.

It is recommended that you immediately notify your insurance company that you have been involved in a traffic collision and provide them with the exchanged information. If your insurance company requires a police number, the Petaluma Police Department can provide you with an event number: PE_____.

If your vehicle is towed from the scene, you need to contact the tow company directly. You will be responsible for any tow bills incurred. The driver of a motor vehicle who is involved in a collision which results in damage to the property of any person in excess of \$1000 or in bodily injury shall, within 10 days after the collision, report the collision (DMV SR-1 form) to the California Department of Motor Vehicles (pursuant to California Vehicle Code section 16000).
